The concept goes beyond the conventional recycling of materials, it exceeds the value of the original product. Garbage repurposed to create and at the same time end not in wasteland adding problems to our environment but continue its life as an art.

The works are an attempt at creating, to the greatest extent possible, a selfportrait of a place, Cyprus, with its topology as the initial basis of inspiration. Using salvaged copper from the island as material, the methodology for the creation of the works incorporates the climate of Cyprus itself: the coloration of the pieces is a direct conversation between the material and its environment, achieved through multiple exposures to the air and sun of the island. The resulting works reflect a communion with their place of creation, both depicting and personifying their source.

Transient Forms is a collection of mostly smaller objects depicting an exploration and reflection of transfiguration and existence. The cyclical nature of the passage of life and the condition that distinguishes animals and plants from inorganic matter, their capacity for growth, reproduction and continual change. Each form is forged upon a hollow base structure whose overlaying skins of brass or copper have been beaten back to emphasise the skeleton and push the covering material to its physical limits.



OPSIS

Watch your tail lights, is my first painting based on a series of photos I took almost 15 years ago.When first discovering the car scrap yards located outside of Limassol, I was immediately intrigued and attracted to them. Being sensitive to environmental and societal issues made me think about the end of life of this status symbol that we regard very high in our society. Cars are still something we strive for in life and still have a great importance even though things are changing slowly these days. That was one aspect that attracted me to such places.

The other was simply the sort of beauty these places had with the cars crumpled on one another, the compositions and the colors that came out of these places. There was something very cinematic and poetic about them.

OPSIS

Prints are made directly on objects found on escapades to places like the car yards and factories in the industrial areas around limassol.

They are experimental in their approach as each print is unique and the result is almost unknown in appearance. This allows me to have freedom in the composition and results in working this way.

The abstract patterns of the unGlued series are printed from the glue that can be found on the back of marble or stone slabs from a factory here in limassol.

I combined various types of recycled materials to create the canvas including cardboard, tapes, staples and paper from delivery packaging, with a scrap wood on the back to support it. For the painting I also combined a wide range of materials such as acrylic and oil paint, oil pastels, acrylic spray and pencil which create this chaotic yet organised synthesis.
